IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Admission on open day is free. However, due to the heavy demand, numbered tickets will be issued free of charge by the Austrian Federal Theatres ticket office (Operngasse 2, 1010 Vienna) from August 1st on. Visitors can choose between two times: 2.00 p.m. or 5.30 p.m.

Public entrance: Opernring (main entrance). You can move around the opera house freely between 2 and 4 p.m., or between 5.30 and 7.30 p.m. Please note the exact time schedule for the individual stations. If you need any information, please do not hesitate to contact our employees at the information and sales desk beside the grand staircase.

The box office under the arcades will be open between 9 a.m. and 6 p.m., the box office in the foyer between 9.00 a.m. and 7.30 p.m. There will also be an information stand with important opera house brochures to the right of the grand staircase.

Smoking is prohibited throughout the opera house. The stalls cloakrooms may be used free of charge. The doctor's room is located on the ground floor.

The open day will be concluded by a half-hour final show on the open stage. Please keep your admission ticket, as it serves as a seating ticket during the demonstrations in the auditorium. Your visit to the opera house ends after the stage show.

Open day will be rounded out by the sale of photos, books, CDs, DVDs, LPs and souvenirs in the Arcadia Opera Shop (Kärntner Strasse 40) as well as catering by Gerstner and the Vienna Opera Café.
